I am s Staff Nurse at the Accident & Emergency Department at Victoria Hospital, Kirkcaldy, employed by NHS Fife. I have been asked to provide further information to clarify points from my previous statement given to the Police Investigations & Review Commissioner (PIRC).

Today I have been asked to provide further information regarding the temperature of the patient Sheku Bayoh when he was admitted on 3 May 2015.

When Mr Bayoh was admitted I was tasked with taking his temperature and checking his blood sugar level.

WITNESS STATEMENT

Normally if there is someone available to note things such as temperature, pulse and blood pressure and oxygen saturation, this will be done. However, it can be, with cardiac arrest patients, if no one is available, that this is not done as the focus of the team is on the patient and their care. This was the case with Mr Bayoh. Although I took his temperature, this was not noted due to the seriousness of his condition and all team members being focused on him.

From what I remember his temperature was 35.8 degrees. It was only 0.2 degrees below a normal temperature range. This is not classed as hypothermic. Temperatures of 35 degrees and under would be classed as hypothermic.

I gave this information to Dr Gillian Pickering who was leading the team.

If possible I would record this normally, into a chart on paper. In this patient's case I went straight into performing CPR to try and save his life, so it wasn't recorded. If noted, the paper chart would go into the patient's file.

The 3rd May 2015 was my second day in the Accident & Emergency Department and this was a very memorable incident. That's why I remember what his temperature was. I also remember that his blood sugar level was normal.
