Just back from leave. I tried to get a hold of you before I left on a training course. Can you have a look at this and check that it meets your requirements. I have mentioned the data which appears on the device after seizure and the initial examination here in the conclusions. It would be foolish to fail to mention what seems to have happened when the device was out of our hands and possible yours. If there is a reason for the activity that can be explained i.e. someone switched it on to look for something let me know and I can add something in. If I do not mention it in some form then any future defence examination will attempt to use it to discredit the seizure and examination – they may still but at least we are being up front.
